Dear Brother Knights,

We open the newspaper and mail today and we find all kinds of advertisements for Christmas gifts, decorations and super discount sales. What happened to Thanksgiving? It seems like every day now is "Black Friday".

But the beginning of this December is really the season we call Advent. The Church begins its new ecclesiastical year with a change in colors of the vestments and the eschatological readings. The word 'advent' is Latin for 'a coming or arrival'. The idea behind it is that God came to earthly life and lived among us. It's something to celebrate, rejoice, because just by being in it, God was giving the supreme blessing to the created world.

Advent is a season of preparation. In Advent we thank God for Christ's first coming, prepare for his final coming at the end of time, and celebrate Christ's presence among us today through the Spirit. God loved and wanted to share that love. In order to rescue the created world from evil, God chose to come here to walk the earth and to die. The only way to start such a thing is as a baby, and the only way to be a baby is to be born. Hence CHRISTMAS. Because Christmas is centered in the new hope brought by a baby it's very child-oriented holiday and Advent leads us up to that baby.

For most people, Advent becomes a time to get ready for whatever you're doing with family and friends on Christmas, and not a time to get ready for the Christ child. The bigger Christmas becomes the more it swallows up Advent. In fact, whatever Christmas-y thing we think of as being done before Christmas Day is actually done in Advent. Everything after Thanksgiving and lately even before Thanksgiving is now seen as part of Christmas. The main problem is that people no longer keep their Christmas focus on Christ, and then that Christ-less Christmas saps Christ from Advent. Practicing Advent as a religious season may help us recover Christmas, but it can't do it by itself. If you don't look to Jesus everyday you'll lose Advent and Christmas. It'll be a tiring rush, not a loving celebration, and it'll be about family or money or image and not our loving Maker.

As we make preparations for the coming of the Christ child in our homes let's prepare our souls thanking God and asking for His forgiveness for our misgivings and sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Without a doubt, it would make it a Merry Christmas for you.


